

# JAMES THOMPSON

1969 - 1970

James Thompson was appointed state Auditor by Governor Louis B. Nunn to fill the vacancy created by the death of Clyde Conley. Thompson served the unexpired term of Conley and then ran against Mary Louise Foust who was elected state Auditor in 1970.

A Republican, Thompson was a graduate of Yale and the University of Louisville law school. He was president of the Old South Insurance Company of Louisville and was an heir of the Glenmore distilling family.

Thompson and his wife had four children.
